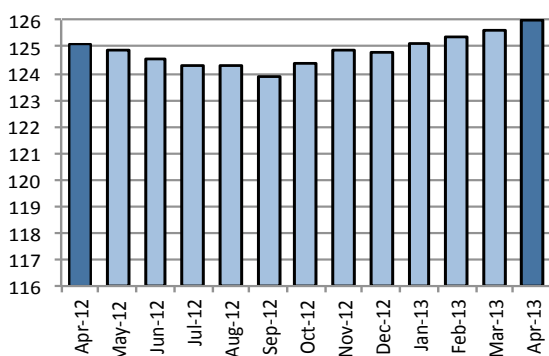
### Consumer Price Index – April 2013

Information released today by Statistics Canada indicates that the Yellowknife All-Items Consumer Price Index rose 0.7% from April 2012. By comparison, the annual price increase was 0.4% for Canada, 1.3% for Edmonton and 0.7% for Whitehorse.

#### CPI - Yellowknife April 2012 to April 2013



In Yellowknife, of the eight major components, four posted increases in April 2013 compared to April 2012. Prices for health & personal care posted no change. The alcoholic beverages & tobacco products and food components were the main upward contributors to the rise in the CPI, while the recreation, education & reading component was the main downward contributor. The shelter and clothing & footwear components both increased by 0.9%, while transportation declined by 0.4%, as well as household operations & furnishings (-0.2%).

Comparing April 2013 with March 2013, overall prices in Yellowknife increased by 0.3%. Prices rose for most major components over the last month with the exception of food and recreation, education & reading components, both of which posted a decrease of 0.2%. Most notably, prices increased for clothing & footwear (2.0%), household operations & furnishing (0.8%) and transportation (0.7%).

CPI values for Yellowknife and Whitehorse include estimates of price changes for owned accommodation based on the price of rental accommodation. As a result, the all-items indexes published for these centers are not strictly comparable to those for Canada and Edmonton.
