

# Consumer Price Index

December 2015

## OVERVIEW

Information released today by Statistics Canada indicates that the Yellowknife All-Items Consumer Price Index in December rose 1.5% compared to one year ago. By comparison, the annual price increase was 1.6% for Canada, 1.6% for Edmonton, and 0.8% in Whitehorse.

Compared to December 2014, consumer prices increased in Yellowknife for most major components with the exception of shelter and alcoholic beverages & tobacco products. Higher prices for food (5.8%) and clothing (4.3%), were offset by lower prices for fuel oil and other fuels (-26.0%) and gasoline (-10.7%).

**Canada & Yellowknife, 2000 to 2015**

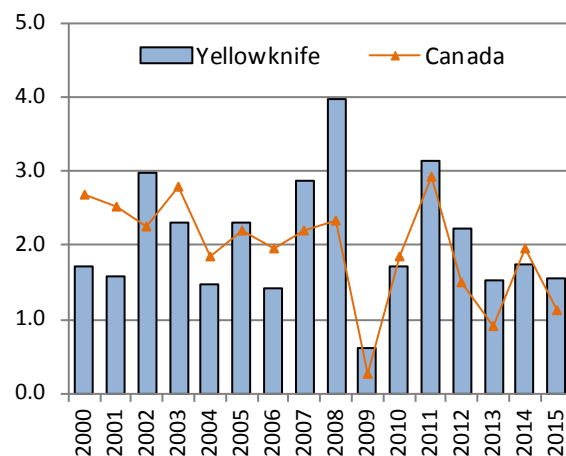


Figure 1 shows how prices change from one year to the next based on the 12-month average index. Businesses tend to use this rate for the calendar year (January to December) to adjust salaries or evaluate the prices of their goods and services.

Between 2014 and 2015, the calendar year inflation rate for Yellowknife was 1.6%. This was a slight decrease from 2014, and the third consecutive year where the rate was below 2%. The Canadian inflation rate was also lower in 2015 than 2014.
