

Consumer Price Index – February 2015

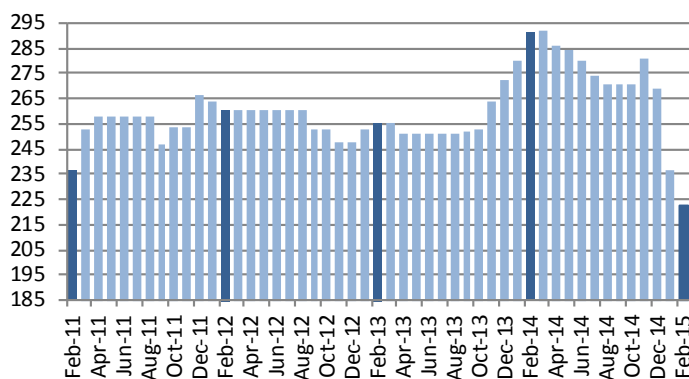
Information released today by Statistics Canada indicates that the Yellowknife All-Items Consumer Price Index rose 0.4% compared to one year ago. By comparison, the annual price increase was 1.0% for Canada, 0.9% for Edmonton while prices in Whitehorse declined by 1.5%.

On an annual basis, the price of food rose by 4.6% since February 2014. This increase was mostly offset by price declines in shelter, clothing & footwear, and transportation. A notable decline was in energy products which fell 11.4% compared to 12 months ago. The decrease in energy prices was a result of lower prices for gasoline and fuel oil and other fuels which fell by 18.1% and 23.7% respectively.

CPI - Fuel Oil And Other Fuels Yellowknife, February 2011 to February 2015



As the graph indicates, the price of fuel oil and other fuels have sharply declined over the last two months, falling by 11.9% in January and 6.0% in February. These decreases have caused the price of fuel oil and other fuels to reach its lowest level in over 4 years.

CPI values for Yellowknife and Whitehorse include estimates of price changes for owned accommodation based on the price of rental accommodation. As a result, the all-items indexes published for these centres are not strictly comparable to those for Canada and Edmonton.
