Consumer Price Index – January 2013

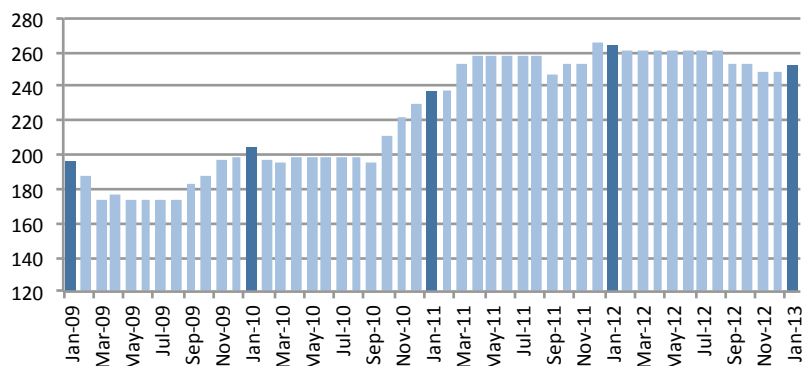
Information released today by Statistics Canada indicates that the Yellowknife All-Items Consumer Price Index rose 0.8% from January 2012. By comparison, the annual price change was 0.5% for Canada, 1.7% for Whitehorse and -0.4% for Edmonton.

Compared to January 2012, consumer prices in Yellowknife increased for most major components with the exception of transportation and health & personal care. The highest price increases over the last 12 months were for alcoholic beverages & tobacco products (3.0%) and clothing & footwear (3.0%). Over the same period, shelter costs increased by 1.0%; a result of higher electricity prices offset by lower fuel oil & other fuels (heating oil) prices.

CPI - Fuel Oil And Other Fuels Yellowknife, January 2009 to January 2013



Since January 2009, the price of fuel oil & other fuels has risen, with increases typically occurring during the fall and winter months. However, over the last 12 months, prices have increased only once. In January 2013, fuel oil & other fuels increased by 1.8% and was a main contributor to the 0.2% overall monthly price increase in Yellowknife.

CPI values for Yellowknife and Whitehorse include estimates of price changes for owned accommodation based on the price of rental accommodation. As a result, the all-items indexes published for these centers are not strictly comparable to those for Canada and Edmonton.
