Consumer Price Index – January 2014

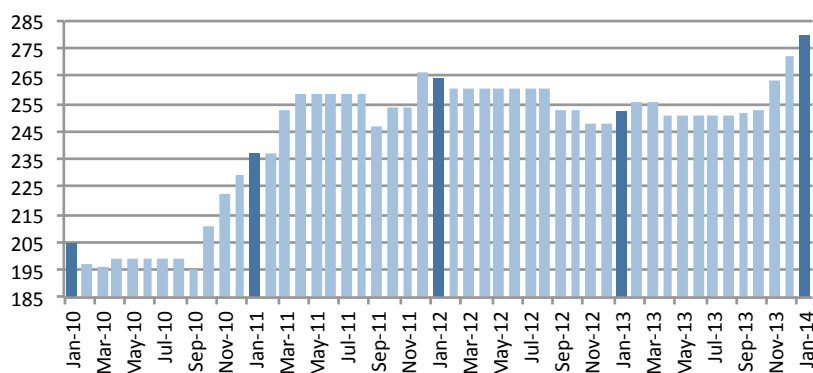
Information released today by Statistics Canada indicates that the Yellowknife All-Items Consumer Price Index rose 1.5% compared to January 2013. By comparison, the annual price increase was 1.5% for Canada, and 2.2% for both Edmonton and Whitehorse.

Compared to January 2013, consumer prices increased for most major components in Yellowknife with the exception of clothing and footwear. The highest price increase over the last 12 months was for shelter; a result of higher fuel oil & other fuels (heating oil) prices (10.8%) and electricity prices (4.8%). Other notable annual price increases were for food and health & personal care (2.5%).

Between January 2014 and December 2013, prices in Yellowknife increased 0.3%. This monthly increase was mostly a result of higher prices for fuel oil & other fuels and private transportation. Fuel prices have increased over the last 3 months, coinciding with the start of the home heating season.

CPI values for Yellowknife and Whitehorse include estimates of price changes for owned accommodation based on the price of rental accommodation. As a result, the all-items indexes published for these centers are not strictly comparable to those for Canada and Edmonton.
