OVERVIEW

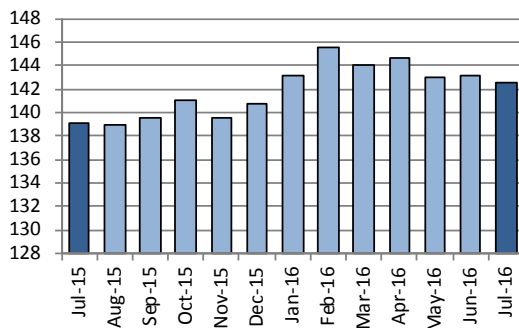
Information released today by Statistics Canada indicates that the Yellowknife All-Items Consumer Price Index in July rose 0.8% compared to one year ago. By comparison, the annual price increase was 1.3% for Canada, 0.9% for Edmonton, 0.8% for Whitehorse and 3.1% for Iqaluit.

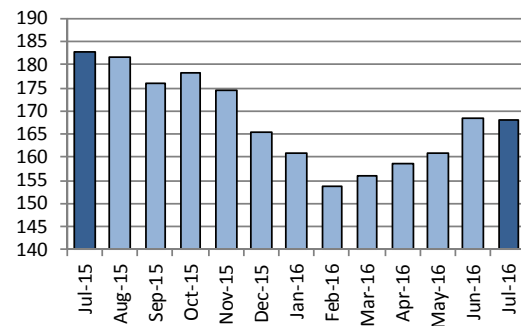

Compared to July 2015, prices increased in Yellowknife for most major components with the exception of recreation, education & reading and shelter. Food contributed to the increase, rising by 2.4% while energy products fell by 8.1% since July 2015. While the price of food is higher than 12 months ago, it has steadily decreased since February 2016. In contrast, the price of energy products have steadily increased since February.

On a monthly basis, the overall Yellowknife index decreased by 0.2%; the first monthly decline this year. Lower prices for food, household operations & furnishings and transportation were partially offset by increases in other components.
