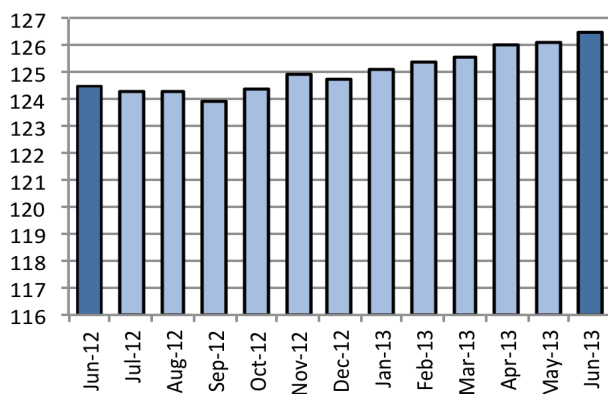
Consumer Price Index – June 2013

Information released today by Statistics Canada indicates that the Yellowknife All-Items Consumer Price Index rose 1.6% from June 2012. By comparison, the annual price increase was 1.2% for Canada, 2.2% for Edmonton and 2.3% for Whitehorse.

In Yellowknife, of the eight major components, seven posted increases in June 2013 compared to June 2012. Over this time, prices for alcoholic beverages & tobacco products increased by 3.7% while transportation prices rose 3.2%. Household operations & furnishings was the only component where prices decreased since May 2012.

Comparing June 2013 with May 2013, overall prices in Yellowknife increased by 0.3%. Prices rose for most major components over the last month with the exception of health & personal care (-0.9%) and clothing & footwear (-0.5%). Most notably, prices increased for food (0.8%),

transportation (0.6%) and recreation, education & reading (0.5%).

CPI values for Yellowknife and Whitehorse include estimates of price changes for owned accommodation based on the price of rental accommodation. As a result, the all-items indexes published for these centers are not strictly comparable to those for Canada and Edmonton.
