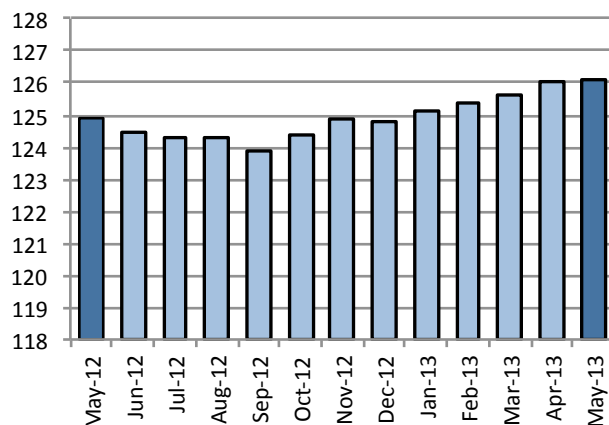
### Consumer Price Index – May 2013

Information released today by Statistics Canada indicates that the Yellowknife All-Items Consumer Price Index rose 1.0% from May 2012. By comparison, the annual price increase was 0.7% for Canada, 2.1% for Edmonton and 0.9% for Whitehorse.

#### CPI - Yellowknife May 2012 to May 2013



In Yellowknife, of the eight major components, six posted increases in May 2013 compared to May 2012. Over this time, prices for alcoholic beverages & tobacco products increased by 3.6% while food prices rose 2.3%. Household operations & furnishings was the only component where prices decreased since May 2012. Prices for clothing & footwear posted no change.

Comparing May 2013 with April 2013, overall prices in Yellowknife increased by 0.1%. Price increases for transportation, health & personal care and recreation, education & reading were mostly offset by price decreases for food, shelter, household operations & furnishings and clothing.

CPI values for Yellowknife and Whitehorse include estimates of price changes for owned accommodation based on the price of rental accommodation. As a result, the all-items indexes published for these centers are not strictly comparable to those for Canada and Edmonton.
