Consumer Price Index – May 2014

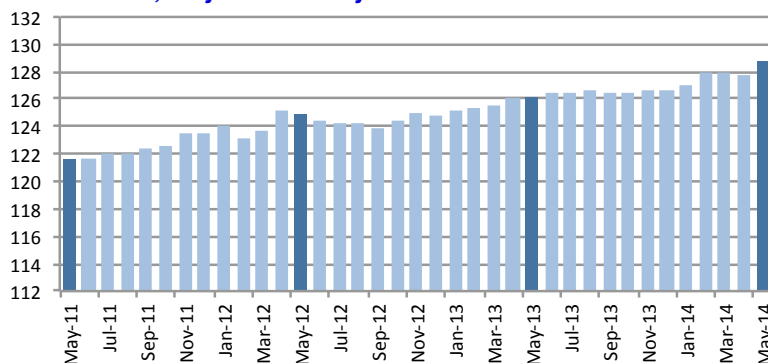
Information released today by Statistics Canada indicates that the Yellowknife All-Items Consumer Price Index rose 2.1% compared to one year ago. By comparison, the annual price increase was 2.3% for Canada, 1.9% for Edmonton and 2.0% for Whitehorse.

Over the one-year period, consumer prices increased for most major components in Yellowknife with the exception of clothing & footwear. The highest price increase between May 2013 and May 2014 was for shelter (3.4%); a result stemming from higher prices for fuel oil & other fuels (heating oil) and electricity.

CPI - All Items Yellowknife, May 2011 to May 2014



Between April 2014 and May 2014, prices in Yellowknife increased 0.8%; the highest monthly increase in over two years. This increase was mostly a result of higher prices for food and recreation, education & reading. Of the major components, only clothing and footwear declined between April and May

CPI values for Yellowknife and Whitehorse include estimates of price changes for owned accommodation based on the price of rental accommodation. As a result, the all-items indexes published for these centers are not strictly comparable to those for Canada and Edmonton.
