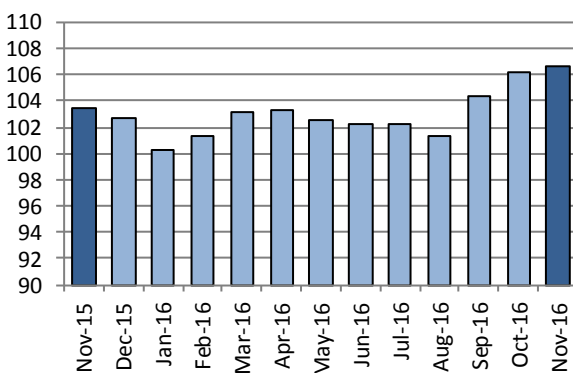
OVERVIEW

Information released today by Statistics Canada indicates that the Yellowknife All-Items Consumer Price Index in November rose 1.1% compared to one year ago. By comparison, the annual price increase was 1.2% for Canada, 0.2% for Edmonton, 1.7% for Whitehorse and 2.5% for Iqaluit.

Yellowknife CPI - Clothing & Footwear November 2015 to November 2016



Compared to November 2015, prices increased in Yellowknife for most major components with the exception of health & personal care. Higher prices for clothing & footwear (3.1%) and alcoholic beverages & tobacco products (3.4%) were offset by lower prices for personal care (-4.4%) and energy products (-3.0%).

As indicated by the graph, all of the price increase in clothing & footwear occurred over the last three months, most recently increasing by 0.5% between October and November 2016.

Comparing October 2016 to November 2016, overall prices in Yellowknife decreased by -0.2%. Prices fell for most major components over the last month, with the exception of food, shelter and clothing & footwear.
