Consumer Price Index – September 2014

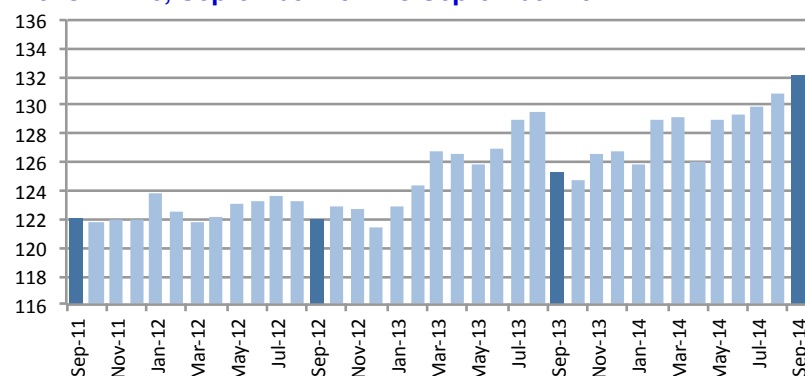
Information released today by Statistics Canada indicates that the Yellowknife All-Items Consumer Price Index rose 1.8% compared to one year ago. By comparison, the annual price increase was 2.0% for Canada, 2.2% for Edmonton and 0.7% for Whitehorse.

Over the one-year period, consumer prices increased for all major components in Yellowknife with the exception of recreation, education & reading. The largest year over year change was a 7.0% increase in the water, fuel and electricity component of shelter. The price of energy, which includes electricity and fuel oil and other fuels sub-components, increased 5.3% from one year ago.

CPI - Food from Stores Yellowknife, September 2011 to September 2014



Contributing to the September 2013 to September 2014 increase was a 5.4% rise in food from stores. While the price of food from stores has fluctuated over the past two years, the overall trend has been upward. Recently the trend has been more defined as prices have steadily increased over the last four months.

CPI values for Yellowknife and Whitehorse include estimates of price changes for owned accommodation based on the price of rental accommodation. As a result, the all-items indexes published for these centers are not strictly comparable to those for Canada and Edmonton.
