

Consumer Price Index – September 2015

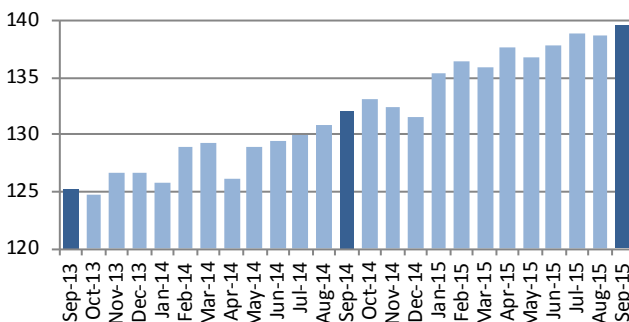
Information released today by Statistics Canada indicates that the Yellowknife All-Items Consumer Price Index rose 1.9% compared to one year ago. By comparison, the annual price increase was 1.0% for Canada, 1.6% for Edmonton, and 0.6% in Whitehorse.

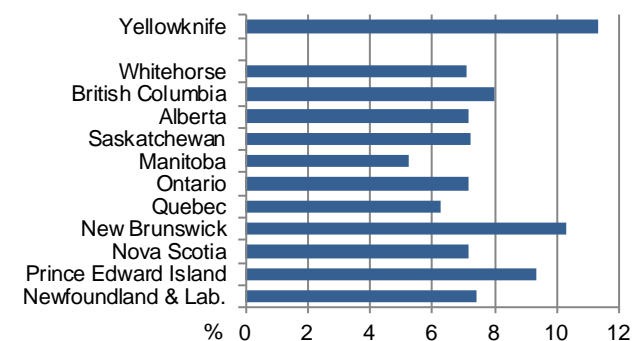

Compared to September 2014, consumer prices increased in Yellowknife for most major components with the exception of shelter. Higher prices for recreation, education & reading (5.6%), food (4.9%) and clothing & footwear (4.6%) were offset by lower prices for fuel oil and other fuels (-24.2%) and gasoline (-10.6%).

Over the last 2 years, there has been an upward trend in the price of food from stores in Yellowknife. While every jurisdiction in Canada has experienced a price rise over this time, the increase has been more pronounced in Yellowknife.
