

Consumer Price Index

September 2016

OVERVIEW

Information released today by Statistics Canada indicates that the Yellowknife All-Items Consumer Price Index in September rose 0.5% compared to one year ago. By comparison, the annual price increase was 1.3% for Canada, 0.6% for Edmonton, 0.2% for Whitehorse and 2.3% for Iqaluit.

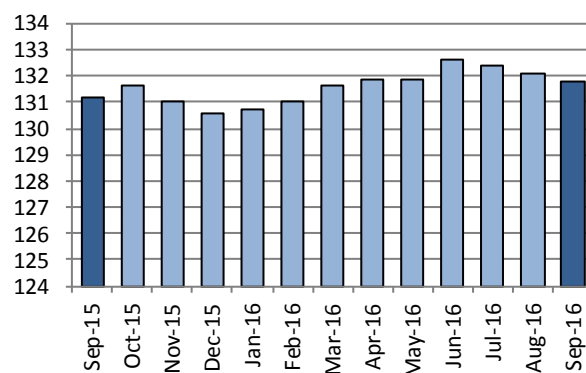

Compared to September 2015, prices varied by major components with half decreasing and half increasing over the one year period. Higher prices for transportation, household operations & furnishings and food were offset by lower prices for energy, health & personal care and recreation, education & reading.

On a monthly basis, the overall Yellowknife index decreased for the third month in a row, declining by 0.2% between August and September 2016. Higher prices for clothing & footwear and alcoholic beverages & tobacco products were offset by decreases in the other components.
